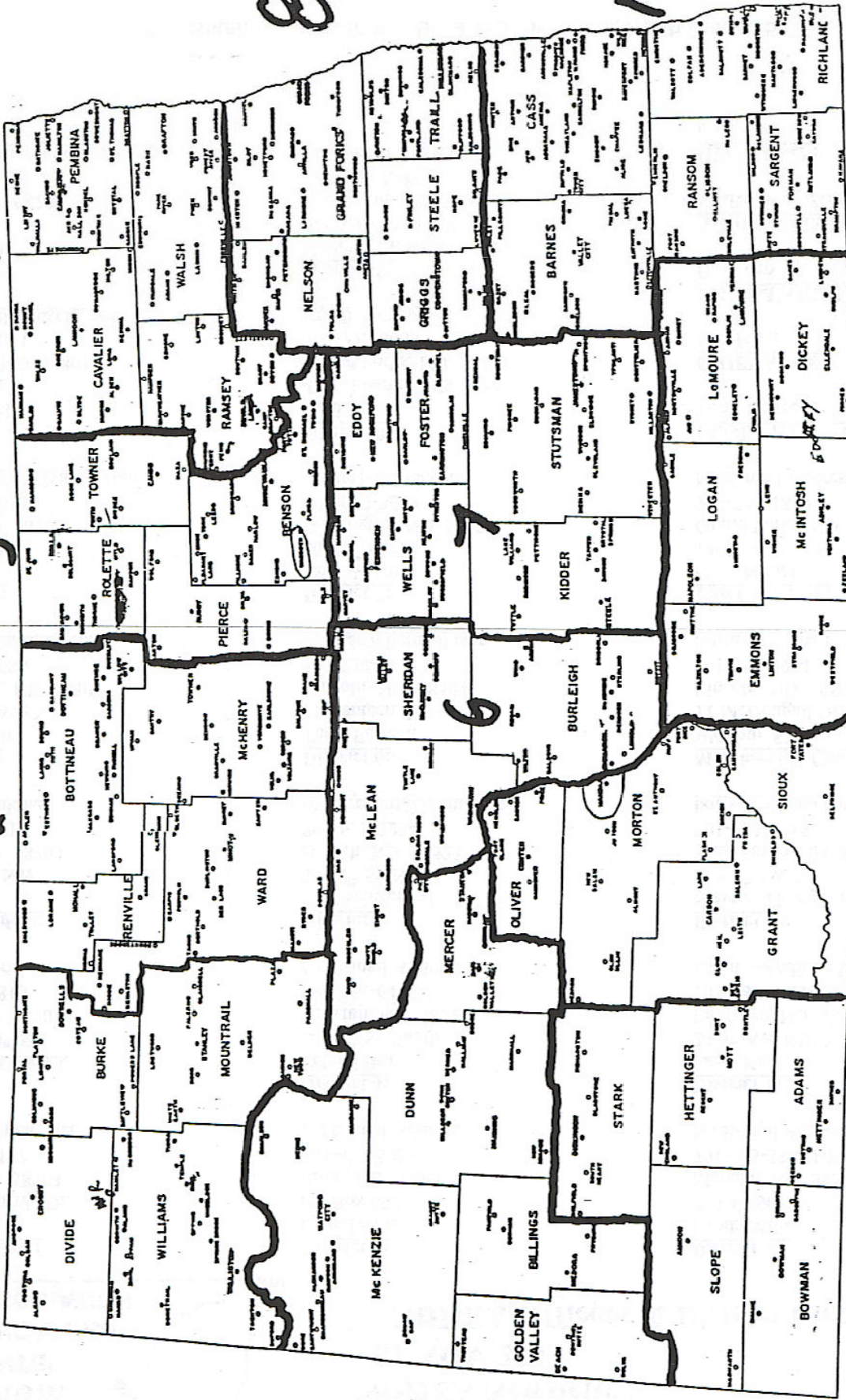

**APRIL 16, 2005**  
**MEETING CALLED TO ORDER 1:00 P.M.**

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by President Rod O'Clair.

SECRETARIES REPORT: None was read as Secretaries computer had crashed. Representatives had copies within their newsletters. Motion by Dave Cox and seconded by Don Meyer to accept minutes as presented. Motion voted on and passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Dave Cox presented several reports as well as charts and graphs as evidence of the new software's capabilities. The board reviewed each report and discussed which to use and which to omit from the quarterly meetings. Motion by Lori and second by Don to have monthly report of income and expenses presented at each meeting. Motion voted on and passed. Additional discussion on several other reports led to a motion by Curt and seconded by Dave to include two additional reports titled Income and Spending Account Transactions by NDHEA and eliminates all other reports at this time. Motion voted on and passed.

When asked about individual district accounts, saving and CD balances, Dave said at this time he had not

figured out how to get the software to allow him to produce these reports. He will be doing additional research and talking with associates in Minot to obtain the required information. Dave stated the balance of the checkbook was at \$3,119.44 and the CD and savings accounts had not changed from the February meetings. The payment to Souris River phone was for the home page and Internet access the cost is \$47.59 per two month's service. Motion by Al and a second by Don to approve the Treasury Report as presented. Motion was voted on and passed.

OLD BUSINESS: Dave reported that Mailboxes, Etc. had closed and not notified us of their closing. Therefore any mail sent to our address was going back to the original sender. Lynda Miller spent considerable time in researching this and had the post office file a forwarding order installed so for the next year, all mail will be forwarded on to our new address. The new address is: **PO Box 897, Minot, ND 58702-0897**. The entire board seconded the thanks expressed to Lynda for time and effort spent to resolve this issue.

OWNERSHIP LABELS: Dave stated that the NDHEA ownership labels were not ready as planned but would be ready for the next quarterly meeting.

DONATION FORMS: Dave stated that because of the new address the revised donation forms were no longer valid. Jim Carter said that he had reproduced the donation forms already and would still mail them out as they will be forwarded on for one more year. When the current supply is used up, he will reproduce more. It was decided to also order 500 sheets of letterhead with the new address on white paper.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

MEMBERSHIP-There are currently 150 members to date. Sharon contacted all of last year's members and all but 27 renewed. She gave membership cards and pins to each district representative to hand out to new members rather than mail them out as it requires padded envelopes to do so.

CAPS-Let it be known that the cap chairman is Ruth Hubbard, not Dave Cox. He will forward all e-mail on to her, but all mail and phone calls should be addressed to her. Dave stated that most of the current stock has been used up and Ruth is contemplating another order.

NEWSLETTER– Neva Walsh through a proxy brought up that there more than likely will be a prize giveaway associated with the newsletter during each issue. This will be announced during the next mailing.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE: Discussed the number of bills passed to date, that driving off of established trails during upland bird hunting had passed, that hunting on reservations without obtaining State licenses had passed. There were several copies of the multiple changes to regulations rather than explain to everyone. Updates are available through the ND Game and Fish website or the State of ND website for updates.

AUDIT AND FINANCE: Clint Baxter from Minot has agreed to lend his assistance with the IRS and State forms due on a yearly basis. He is an accountant who is known to several Minot instructors.

WEBSITE: The website should be up within a month for all to use. At this time there will be no on-line donations being taken.

HISTORY: Dave is currently taking care of it and asks each district to send anything of interest or importance to him.

#### OTHER BUSINESS:

Jim Carter discussed potential thoughts for training sessions during the 2005 yearly sessions. Jim would like to have the NDHEA take a larger presence in the instruction of the certified instructors. He asked everyone to consider getting a group together from the association to give training techniques to others to aid in the teaching of the new course. Nothing is set at this time, but Jim would like input at the next quarterly meeting. The Game and Fish Department would pay for the production of teaching aids to be used for the sessions. Jim brought up recent negative comments from several instructors over the new course materials and tests. He also stated that some had even brought none approved materials and videos into the classroom. He reminded everyone that all instructors had signed a form stating that they would teach the approved course materials provided by the Game and Fish Department. He stated that the Instructor's guidelines that were handed out over the past two years follow the new text book that is being used. He also discussed the test and the amount of material relating to the wildlife management that is being questioned. Jim stated that before the test was authorized, it was

checked with the Flesch-Kincaid methods of ranking education levels. The reading ease is rated at 59.2% and the grade level at 6.4, so it is felt everything is teachable with time and effort by the course instructors.

#### DISTRICT REPORTS:

District 1-None

District 2-None

District 4-Mentioned that several courses are in session, with more to start.

District 5-Classes are ongoing.

District 6-New TV/CD/VCR bought for classes in Lincoln-one student from Garrison sent to summer camp-donated \$500 for operating expenses for Wildlife Federal Camp-contemplating a field day in Wilton in June if things come together.

District 7-Internet class being offered in New Rockford.

District 8-Classes in session.

District 9-None.

District 10-Class totals appear to be lower this year, unsure if it is because of online issues.

District 11-Two classes being taught at schools, four others in sessions in other communities.

District 12-Classes are just beginning. Wildlife federal is discussing holding a large scale class and may need assistance.

NEW BUSINESS: Clayton made a motion that all district representatives make a personal effort to contact instructors in their district to discuss the problems that were brought up with the new test and class materials. Seconded by Al. Discussion was had that perhaps a motion was not necessary but that it should be discussed as passing on information was the responsibility of being a district representative. The motion was voted on and failed.

LIFETIME MEMBERSHIPS: Payment for lifetime memberships was discussed. It was brought up that if a schedule of payment over a year was granted, perhaps more people would purchase them. Motion by Dave to accept payments for life membership over the course of the **calendar year it is applied for**. Also if the regular membership has already been paid for during that calendar year, it will be deducted from the cost of the life membership. Second by Al Klatt. Motion was voted on and passed.

DRAFT MISSION STATEMENT: President Rod has asked Keith Weston to come to the meeting to discuss

the formulation of a mission and vision statement. After a brief discussion as to how to develop these two issues, a brainstorming session was had to formulate key words to scribe our association and instructors. The group was divided into two rooms where each group came up with three vision statements. The groups came back together where the three were randomly selected. After additional work, two were eliminated and one statement went through additional scrutiny until a draft was acceptable to all present.

**DRAFT MISSION STATEMENT:** A proactive, informed group of ND volunteers who dedicate themselves to promoting quality education, who are recognized as leaders in enriching our hunting heritage with respect to safety, integrity and conservation. Motion by Dave to accept the mission statement as presented, with second by Leland. Motion by Lori second by Al to table approval of mission statement at this time.

**DRAFT VISION STATEMENT:** A draft vision statement was also read: To be the Instructor that teaches the hunters of tomorrow.

**MEMBERSHIP INCENTIVES:** Rod brought up the membership incentives again. Some possibilities discussed were membership pins/hunting accessories and training aids. It was mentioned again that currently the membership fee is \$10 per year, which does not allow much money to purchase things for members as well as fund programs.

**REQUESTS:** Missouri Valley Shooting Sports asked to receive a donation of \$500 to help fund the August shooting day at the McLean Bottom range and the first time pheasant hunt in September. Motion by Lori, second by Don to make the requested donation of \$500 to Missouri Valley Shooting Sports. During discussion, a motion to table donation until July by Dave so he can verify account balances, second by Mike. Motion to table was voted on and did not pass. Vote to approve motion to donate \$500 to Missouri Valley Shooting Sports was made and passed. Dave will coordinate time to issue check with Lynda Miller.

President Rod asked everyone to keep considering ways to promote our organization and think about goals to help achieve our mission statement. He also asked everyone to think about the mission and vision statement to work on them at the next meeting. Rod expressed his concern that we do not promote ourselves enough and

we have done little to achieve recognition for what we do. He would like the board to become more active besides the dates of our meetings to help the organization to grow and be recognized.

Dave Cox stated that he had been approached about two children from District 2 who wanted to go to camp and was wondering if anyone else had anyone interested in going. Lori had one possibility and she would let Dave know by the following weekend.

**ZAP SHOOT:** The annual Zap Trap Shoot will be held at Zap on August 6th. All interested persons can contact Lori Schweigert about details.

**MOTION TO ADJOURN:** Motion by Mike, second by Curt to adjourn the quarterly meeting at 5:30 p.m. Motion voted on and passed.
