Caps for Safety

I debated another article on cap sales but this is an important benefit of membership in NDHEA. You can get a hunter orange cap, expressing your dedication to safety when afield, and get it at a reasonable price. Our committee requested a bit of a change in pricing and this was approved at the April board meeting. If you can arrange for the transportation of the caps, such as pick up in Jamestown or transfer to someone to get them to you, the price will be \$8.00 for any size order. If shipped, the orders of less than 24 will remain at \$10.00 per cap.

The quality of the cap has seemed to decrease the last two orders and this was brought to the suppliers attention. The next order is of the Otto brand and cost to NDHEA will be a bit more but you deserve a quality cap.

This is still a major fund raiser for supporting the association's activities and organizational expenses. Every cap order is very much appreciated. In general, civic organizations and wildlife clubs have made special donations to provide caps to the students. When it is estimated there are 700 instructors doing classes, it seems pitiful that less than 20 classes provided the blaze orange caps to students to help insure their safety. The good news is those outstanding instructors have purchased 406 caps so far in 2011.

Please make asking for donations and cap distribution a priority for your class! I can generally ship caps the day after you place a request.

Boat Ramps on Devils Lake

Five boating access sites are currently usable on Devils Lake, and three more are expected to be ready by early summer.

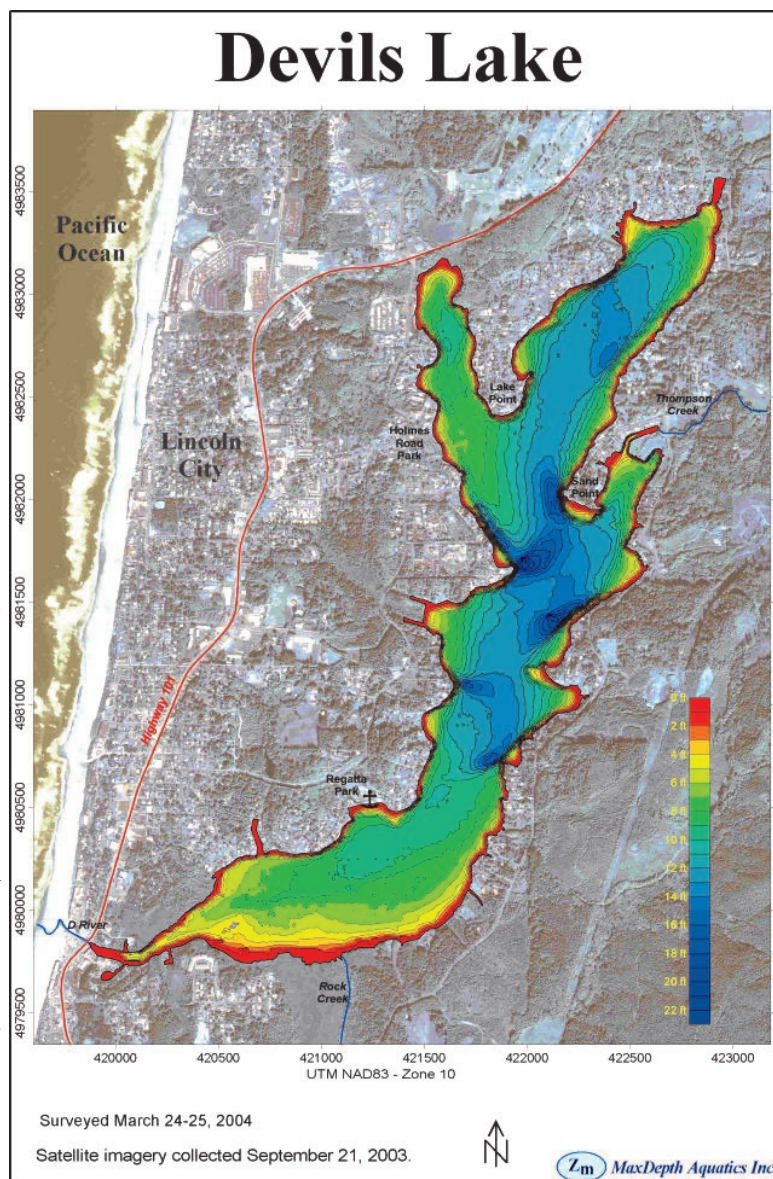
NDGF personnel have completed installing a metal ramp at Pelican Lake on the north side of Highway 19, about one mile east of the junction of old Highway 281.

Ramps were extended a ramp at Six Mile Bay (Schwab) to elevation 1,458 feet above mean sea level, and installed a high-water ramp immediately north of the existing Creel Bay (Lakewood) ramp site. Spirit Lake Casino ramp is still open and Grahams Island State Park ramp is currently usable. Due to changing lake elevations you should call to check for updates.

In addition, work is progressing on raising the East Bay parking area and boat ramps to elevation 1,461 msl, six feet higher than its 2010 elevation.

A new boating access site on Round Lake should be completed in early June, which will provide access to the western part of the lake and replace the Minnewaukan area ramps that were inundated earlier this spring. Benson County officials are working with the Federal Highway Administration for approval to breach the old Highway 281 roadbed, helping facilitate access to the main lake.

Construction of the new access area along ND Highway 20 on the south end of Black Tiger Bay is scheduled to begin in June, with completion scheduled around July 4. The site will include a gravel access road and turnaround area, a 32-foot-wide poured cement ramp, courtesy docks and large parking area.



New Temporary Boating Regulations

The NDGF has established an idle-speed-only restriction for boaters on the Missouri and Heart rivers in the Bismarck-Mandan area.

At a special meeting Tuesday May 24th, Burleigh and Morton county commissions voted to recommend that Game and Fish establish the idle-speed zones, for safety reasons and to protect private property. Game and Fish Director Terry Steinwand approved the official proclamation Tuesday, putting the idle-speed restriction in effect immediately. Because of much higher flows expected to come down the river from Garrison Dam for an extended time, the idle-speed zone will be in place until further notice. Idle-speed-only is defined as operating a boat or other watercraft at the slowest possible speed necessary to maintain steerage.

The Emergency Special Boating Rule is noted below:

Under authority of North Dakota Century Code 20:1-13-12(3) the undersigned Director of the North Dakota Game & Fish Department, makes the following emergency idle speed only rule to be effective immediately and until rescinded for all vessels operating on the Missouri River between a point north of Bismarck where power lines cross the Missouri River approximately 1000 feet south of Steckel boat ramp North of Bismarck at latitude -100.939813 longitude 47.126875 then south to the McLean Bottoms Wildlife Management Area boat ramp at latitude -100.635125 longitude 46.673215; and for all vessels operating on the Heart River from the mouth of the Heart River south of Mandan, ND at latitude -100.842332 longitude 46.767616 then north and west to the highway 6 bridge west of Mandan, ND at latitude -100.904960 longitude 46.814404. Idle speed is defined as the slowest possible speed necessary to maintain steerage.

President Curt Walen called the meeting to order at 1:00pm at the ND Game and Fish Department building.

Jon Hanson NDGF Hunters Education Coordinator comments:

Gave an overview handout and outline for the Online Study Course to the NDHEA for informational purposes. Informed the board of what he sends to perspective volunteer instructors along with the application?

Discussion of his responsibility of two shooting range programs and funding available for improvements to shooting ranges or funding available for new ranges.

Discussed the three things that could shut down a shooting range.

Noise: neighbors that do not like the noise.

If projectiles leave the range and impact someone or another property.

Lead: high concentrations of lead contamination.

He will combine the 2012 NDGF Hunters Education Annual Conference activities and the NDHEA activities into one agenda to allow everybody to see all of the activities.

Pending review of a couple of items, the second weekend in February 2012 is the tentative date of the 2012 Annual Conference.

Social Security Numbers are no longer required on the Hunter Education cards. The Hunters Education department is also trying to eliminate all reference to Social Security Numbers on all of the online enrollment documents also.

Jon stated that the Instructors need to be more diligent on making sure that their students are at least 11 years old.

It was stated that one Instructor had a 9 year old in their class and allowed them to test and passed them, this is not to be allowed.

The IHEA Conference is in North Carolina on June 1st to the 5th. NDGF would like to help sponsor at least two instructors to go to this conference along with some sponsorship by the NDHEA. NDGF and NDHEA should discuss an application and selection process for this conference if there is continued interest to attend.

Discussed, briefly, the revision of the Game and Fish Website.

Mike Miller of Buffalo, who was killed in an accident, was a Hunter Education Instructor, and a member of NDHEA. Jean Oster stated that she would look into getting a sympathy card to the family.

District budgets need to be presented for the Treasurers purpose and possible further executive action.

Treasurer Clint Baxter presented the information to the board about the 503C IRS Tax filings and required forms. The filings do not need to be in until May 15, 2011.

Lynda Miller made a motion to pay Treasurer Clint Baxter \$105.00 for his time to complete the 503C IRS Tax paperwork and filings, seconded by Lori Schweigert. All in favor. Motion carried.

Dale Patrick gave a brief update on the raffle. Stated that to date \$4,400 in account from raffle sales with receipt sent to the Treasurer. At this pace all of the tickets are expected to be sold.

NDHEA was given highlights on the North Dakota Wildlife Federation.

Their education camp is August 7th – 13th, 2011 at the Camp of the Cross. They are looking for people to help with fishing and possibly shooting.

Would like to put together a “Round Table” meeting next spring with several organizations to discuss like issues.

They would like to update their Report All Poachers (R.A.P.) trailers that they take to several events in the state.

They would like to purchase two trailers through sponsorship sales. The logo of the sponsor would then be placed on the trailer or trailers.

Dale Patrick made a motion to contribute \$500.00 for sponsorship to the North Dakota Wildlife Federation for the R.A.P. trailer. The NDHEA logo will go on the trailer with sponsorship. Motion seconded by Lori Schweigert. All in favor. Motion carried.

Dale Patrick made a motion to sponsor four (4) youth at \$200.00 each, \$800.00 total, for the NDWF Youth Conservation Camp being held on August 7th – 13th, 2011 at the Camp of the Cross. Seconded by Jean Oster. All in favor. Motion carried.

New Business Initiative discussion.

Traveling Instructor Team.

Jon of the NDGF stated that at this time there are some new instructor applications for the Williston area that he is processing. That is the area of concern that prompted the thought of the traveling instructor team.

Instead of putting together a traveling instructor team there could be a list made of instructors that would be willing to be contacted if the need arose for some assistance.

Promotion of AR platform rifles.

Discussion brought forth that the AR rifles are another form of the semi-automatic action which we already instruct upon. Even though the AR platform rifles are a specialized firearm, if we start teaching on a specific firearm then where does it stop? There are many specialized firearms on the market and will we have to teach on each one of them. Jon was requested to come up with some literature that could be made available to instructors if they felt the need to teach on that type of firearm. Further discussion was tabled.

Jean Oster brought forth a letter requesting funds for a shooting range reconstruction in Richland County. NDHEA is not here for Range Grants we are here for education. Since Jon handles the Range Grants for the NDGF the information was transferred to him for further review.

Discussion was brought forth for another fundraiser. What if the NDHEA were to purchase some orange colored 12 and 20 gauge dummy rounds with the NDHEA logo and sell them to students for practicing away from class? Jon of the NDGF has a vendor that sells those shells. Jon will supply the NDHEA Board with information on availability and costs so we can research whether it will be a viable fundraiser for the NDHEA.

Committee Reports

Legislative Committee –

Goose Depredation bill passed the legislature. NDGF will be setting up procedures of how the farmers/landowners will be matched with hunters. Along with that there will be some records kept by the NDGF to see which farmers/landowners are complaining about goose depredation and is their land posted or open to

Deer Depredation bill passed the legislature. There have been monies passed to pay for fencing and or labor to install that fencing. Along with that there will be some records kept by the NDGF to see which farmers/ landowners are complaining about deer depredation and is their land posted or open to hunters.

Pronghorn bill passed that allows 12 and 13 year old youth to hunt pronghorn.

By-laws –

There are 6 committees that have not turned in a list of policies and procedures of their committees.

A recommendation was made that the Executive Committee look into the necessity of the policies and procedures being submitted in a written report to the By-laws Committee and exactly what is required to be submitted if anything. There are no procedures in the Constitutional By-laws.

Cap Committee

Cap committee discussed a price change. The price of caps as it stands now is \$10 each if less than 24 caps are ordered. The price of the caps is \$8 each if 24 or more are ordered. The change would make the caps \$8 each for any amount of caps as long as there are no shipping costs. If there are shipping costs then the price would remain at \$8 each and \$10 each based on quantity. The existing price was established by motion and any change to those prices would need to be changed by motion. There have been 380 caps sold this year.

Dale Patrick made a motion that the price for caps be set at \$8.00 each if the caps are hand delivered and do not generate a shipping or transportation cost. Motion seconded by Lee Bratlie. All in favor. Motion carried.
