Junior Instructors:

Request brought forward to recognize individuals as junior instructors prior to certification as accredited hunter educators for their assistance in class support, instruction, and participation in gun handling all under the direct supervision of certified instructors: (examples Gary Lindeman's son a few years back, and District rep Lori Schweigert's son Tyler .)

A certificate of recognition by NDG&F and NDHEA would be awarded to the individuals to be used as merit for scholarships and resumes . Signed by President of NDHEA and make request for acknowledged signature by Jon Hanson of NDG&F if this meets their approval. Purpose : This could be used as a tool to encourage participation of young prospective instructors and keep these individuals engaged and retained.

Terry Kassian expressed concern to check with Jon Hanson for liability concerns for having people not yet certified involved in the class, and it was noted that under instructors direct supervision adults have assisted in class and handling practises. These Criteria would be requested and directed from Jon Hanson provided NDG&F approved of this idea.
